
I may have an update on EPD's by sale day as we are waiting for the genetic tests to come back on all of our Epic calves. Either way we got length, fleshing ability and calving ease in that bull. Performance and calving ease are 3 generations deep.



Pride 045 our former walking herd bull and Active Duty are full brothers. We tried Active Duty to see if there was a difference. We have raised some good Pride sons and this Active Duty calf is pretty special. Like Pride, very well balanced with eye appe




Want to add some ribeye area and use the same bull on virgin heifers? Quasi may be that bull. Notice we are starting to line up calving ease bulls with power for several generations to ensure a consistent product for you.




Koufax is the bull a lot of people came to purchase last year. So far all of his calves have been born unassisted. That matters because this is his full brother. Sabathia has a little less frame but both are well balanced with big nuts.




638 is a cow that throws more birth weight but also weans off more calf. Top marbling black bull being offered. Our Long Haul daughters have amazing udder quality and consistently wean off our top calves. Keep these females.



Have your cows gotten a little big and are you starting to think about backing them down a bit? Guidry will do that without losing muscle mass and shape. A top 5 ribeye per 100 pounds bull that will absolutely work on heifers.








Simba is a nice balanced bull with a top 5 ribeye per 100 pounds and scrotal. His grandam is still in the herd at 11. The leanest bull in the offering, so he should continue to develop well.


561 has gotten the big pasture the last 2 summers because of his shape and trying to keep the Pride lineage going. This bull could really shine in a pasture where your virgin heifers and cows need to share a bull.



Here is a Pay Dirt son who had some gain in him. Keep his daughters as he has some of our best female makers in his mom's pedigree. Really well balanced from every measurable trait and can be used on virgin heifers.



Artimus is another Pay Dirt son who is out of a cow that is a little heavier in the birth weight department. So he is a cow bull that is probably one of the better balanced bulls for carcass traits. Again a great choice for keeping replacements.




Hickok is a new heifer bull we tried. A very well balanced bull in every trait so it feels like a good fit. Good post weaning gain and excellent carcass traits to use on your virgin heifers.




Pay Dirt on a power cow and I got it all. His full sister will have calved by sale day and she is the only Pay Dirt daughter we have. Need a cow bull that will check all the boxes? If he had come at 80 pounds at birth he would not be leaving here.




I seriously considered keeping this bull for a herd bull at weaning time. His growth is excellent and I like the females by Front & Center except for the weakness on ribeye. Many of you will remember the Battillion sons in the past. Real power.



My favorite Epic calf in the offering. Top 5 marbling, ribeye, gain and pelvic. His grandam is the dam of 945 so power runs in the family. Big difference is a lower birth weight option. Probably not a sure fire heifer bull but a top 30% BW EPD.



Abundant is probably not a sure fire heifer bull because this low birth weight is not what his sire does best. However it is what his mom did well. When I line breed home raised sires, I usually get pelvic and big nuts. He is no exception.



The final Epic bull in the group and like his siblings has plenty of marbling. He was injured right after weaning that may have affected his performance. But his mom has already calved to a clean Epic son with a 74 pound bull calf for next years sale.

How the sale works

Each bull will have a price set before the sale. They will range from \$2500 to \$3500.

During the open house time of 11:30 till 2:00 feel free to examine the bulls and eat dinner.

During that time get a buyers number and let the girls know which bulls you are interested in.


You may check the master list at any time during the open house. At 2:00 we will

announce that we are ready for the auction, at that time you need to finalize your selections.


We will start with the highest priced bulls, if more than one buyer is interested in a bull we will have an auction in \$25 dollar increments till the bull is sold. After a bull sells we will ask the new owner if he is done buying, if so I will remove his buyer number from any of the other bulls he had selected. If you are the only one on a bull, you will have the option of taking that bull or passing.

You will not go home with more bulls than you need.

The auction usually takes 45 minutes to an hour.



Tour of Duty and Pride are out of the same cow. We line bred that female for her productivity and it shows in his performance up to weaning. I named this bull Lady's Man because his daughters should be lights out good.



851 will add some pounds at weaning and his daughters will make excellent females. He is a free moving, good base width kind of bull. His dam is super long so we used Aberdeen to add some volume to that length.




I like the style and shape that the Soldier line brings. Trooper has worked well. This calf is very attractive and has some carcass traits in the top 30% of the breed. His calves should sell well either off the cow or on the rail.




Powerful is the best way to describe our Impact sons. Remember that as those Impact daughters start producing bulls for future sales. Vortex's dam was purchased from the Hall dispersal with the intention of using Impact on her.



569 appears to be a lower birth weight cow, so maybe this bull could be used on virgin heifers. Either way Maxed Out will add body length and thickness in a moderate frame. Maxed Out and the Card Shark 1214 bull are out of the same cow.




Aquifers mom was my grandson Riley's first breeding heifer in 4-H. Ross Knott bought her full sister as choice of our replacements that we offered for our 25th sale. Super attractive and very well balanced from an EPD profile and visually.



We all liked this calf all summer, but said the same thing," if he gets big enough." He did. Powerful cow families both on the top and bottom side of his pedigree. To have excellent carcass traits and be easy fleshing is not an easy task.

At the Frey dispersal in North Dakota I liked the 6Z progeny but could afford very few. So I got the semen to create my own. Masculine, thick, growthy sons, with a very distinct shape and look. The few females I did purchase are extremely feminine.




3/4 brother to 920 with some phenotypical similarities. Nicely balanced EPD profile that should leave excellent females in your herd. Z21 did a very nice job in our herd while she was here and left some daughters behind to carry on.



Maxed Out semen is expensive so we are keeping an interest in Gaston who is out of one of our easiest fleshing Lila cows. Top gaining bull with the second largest ribeye. His grand dam is also one of my favorite Mulberry daughters.



Parker is the sire of Riley's steer, who at 16 months at county fair, weighed 1792 and was the top gaining steer in the county. Kion's dam is the grand dam of 926 on the previous page. Performance is bred into this calf with a moderate birth weight.




522 has a full brother to Bunga that weighed in at 84 pounds, so I believe, in spite of being a twin, he will work on virgin heifers. More moderate type of heifer bull to tone down some females that are pushing the envelope for size.




This Deliverance son is a top 5 gaining bull like his brother, 901. Difference is that this one I am very comfortable to use on virgin heifers. His top 5 marbling score and nice ribeye per 100 make him a well balanced choice. He has the same look too.



Bankroll is a bull to use on virgin heifers that has some stretch and eye appeal. The most important fact is the fertility that is stacked in his pedigree. His mom calved 2 days sooner than last year as a second calver. Pretty impressive.



Sterling has done such a nice job here over the years, so it is hard to stop using him. Cash Out is a typical son in that he is attractive with excellent growth and balanced carcass traits. With Mr. Carcass in his pedigree, his females should be excellent



Here is the 6Z son with better carcass traits. 3 of the 4 sires on the bottom side of his pedigree are S Diamond bred. Sterling, Viking, and Mr. Carcass all appear in his ancestry. 4 of the 7 EPD's are in the top 30% plus a top 5 marbling score.



Pongo is the top weaning calf in the offering who continued to do well and also looks the part. The Hi Ho 753 daughters milk really well and are known for ribeye, but not usually for marbling, so he is unique. His daughters should be remarkable.



Top ribeye and top REA/100 in the offering with plenty of look to go with it. His full brother is the 812 bull on display and his mom moved up 2 weeks this year. Fertility should not be an issue as his sire set the bar at the vet clinic with a scrotal of 52 cm




The Gold Bar females are sure leaving an impact on our herd. Not for you as the females nearly all had heifer calves till this spring. Look for those bulls on next years sale. Use these next 3 bulls to build your herd around this blood line.



We leased this sire the last 2 years to follow up on our heifers and purchased him this spring to replace our Gold Bar son who passed away last summer. They were a little bigger at birth yet we assisted none of them. 5 out of 7 EPD's in the top 30%.



Naveen's mother was bought as a bred heifer on the Hall dispersal and had one of our top heifer calves. We are anxiously awaiting a full sibling to him soon, as she looks to have moved up. Top 5 REA/100 and above average marbling.



Cavalry is an attractive, well balanced bull that keeps getting better. No excuses except that he is taking his time in getting there. Sterling daughters usually knock it out of the park. He was used to follow an AI program in a 4-H herd.

Some things you should know about these cattle:

- 1) These bulls were fed on a ration that never exceeded two pounds of corn per 100 pounds of body weight per day per bull plus corn silage. We feel that it is more important to grow bulls that will go out and breed cows and return home looking like they should. Feeding them at the house in bigger pens and more exercise did drop our gains but we believe will make for better bulls for you. Fat bulls are pretty when you buy them but never again.
- 2) The carcass data on these bulls is presented as close to reality as possible. Please use the marbling scores only for in-herd comparisons. Since 1985 we have collected carcass data on every steer we have raised. We have even gone out and bought calves from our own bulls and fed them out. Our 5 year average of 94% choice or prime speaks for itself and includes every calf not kept as a bull or replacement female.
- 3) Our goals are to produce bulls that will sire females that will make excellent replacements and steers with enough performance to weigh 1200-1400 pounds at 12-14 months.
- 4) In the past our cowherd has shown enough fertility that our calf crop is 80%-90% A.I. sired. This fall we were at 90.2% pregnant and so far we are at 52% of our calves were born within 21 days of our first due date. Fertility is the number one ingredient in profitability in a cow/calf program. I think this shows in the scrotal circumferences of these bulls and will show in their daughters.
- 5) This cowherd is not a pampered cowherd. We expect these cows to calve unassisted, get the calf up, and raise it on grazed forages as much as possible. Very few calves are born in the barn and of those fewer are assisted in anyway. That is the cow's job.
 - 6) We will keep the bulls until the first to middle of April at no cost to you. We will deliver the bulls to you at that time. All bulls will be semen checked and ready to work. If any bull has a problem in the first year, we will replace him or refund your money.

HOW THE SALE WORKS:

Each bull will have a price before the sale. They will range from \$2500 to \$3500. During the open house of 11:30 till 2:00 feel free to examine the bulls and eat lunch. During that time get a buyer's number and let the girls know which bulls you would like to bid on. The list is open to inspection at any time. At 2:00 we will announce that the auction is about to start and make your final selections. We will start with the higher priced bulls, if more than one buyer is interested, we will have an auction between the interested buyers. After a bull sells the new owner will be asked if he is done, if so, we will remove his number from the other bulls. If you are alone on a bull you have the right to hold him till the end of the auction or pass. You will not go home with more bulls than you need.
